#### SVdP/CDBG Essential Services Program

The Essential Services Program provides rental assistance to low-to-moderate-income clients who reside in the unincorporated areas of Bexar County or a participating city: Balcones Heights, China Grove, Converse, Elmendorf, Grey Forest, Helotes, Kirby, Leon Valley, Live Oak, Schertz, Somerset, St. Hedwig, Terrell Hills, Universal City and Von Ormy.

Eligibility requirements:

- Must live in one of the participating cities or unincorporated areas of Bexar county
- Must have a notice to vacate or eviction
- Not receiving section 8 or any tenant based rental assistance
- Income must be below 80% of Bexar County Income Limits. Please call to check your income qualifications.

#### SVdP/COSA Rapid Re-Housing Program

The Rapid Re-housing Program is designed to move individuals/families from homelessness to permanent stable housing. Program goals are (1) provide support services that help to eliminate any barriers to maintain housing. These services may include limited financial assistance to reduce shelter time by assisting clients to secure housing as quickly as possible; and (2) budgeting help, and connecting to educational and employment services. Financial assistance may include, security deposits, paying a portion of rent and utility assistance.

#### Family and Community Assistance Program

The Family and Community Assistance Program focuses on providing the proper supports needed to instill self-sufficiency in the clients we serve. Our services include emergency provisions as well as long-term supports in the form of case management, financial assistance, job training, and assistance with pursuing an education.

Eligible clients may qualify for:

- Short term rental assistance
- Create a Smart budget and Housing Stability plan
- Receive Supportive Resources

If clients do not qualify, SVdP may still be able to provide other assistance.
